Silence of the Lambs... the REAL Story.

I want to start by stating unequivocally that, as a Pastor, I am prohibited from making specific endorsements for any political office. (It's a long, non-profit threat I don't agree with, but it is what it is..)

Now... to the blunt point.

It was just announced that between 20 and 30 MILLION Christians will be sitting out this National Election. That gives me pause.

I am not sure how the Church of Jesus Christ in the United States of America came to this condition, but I am not so much appalled that persecution of Jesus People has produced this predictable statistic, but that we, the Christian Church in the United States has even remotely allowed that astronomical number to be considered in the polling percentages of our political cycle.

We just celebrated one of the most joyous days at Holy Trinity Lutheran Ministries where we reached beyond ourselves to be more than a collection of individuals, and a UNIFIED Body of Christ. Built on, of all things... FREEDOM!

"If the Son sets you free, you are free indeed".

So, on November 5th, I am asking you, as the unified Body of Christ, to exercise that freedom. Not given to you by men... but by God.

Some will say I am acting out of bounds as a Pastor. Well, I am also a patriotic American. My father (known as "the Colonel"), instilled in me during my first election experience that you must vote with your conscience, but if you don't vote... you have no voice and you get the government you deserve. It was 1980. Ronald Reagan would go on to win a now-historic and seismic victory. I did not vote for him. When it was over, the "Colonel" asked me, "Are you satisfied with your vote?" I said, "yes, sir". "Good. Well done. Your voice was heard." He never asked how I voted. He congratulated me on participating.

I wasted my vote on a guy named John Anderson (historical context: he won just 6.6% of the vote). I vowed never to waste my vote again. And I never looked back.

Two years later, I became a Christian. And I was told to be silent because Christians are opinionated, judgmental and moral-issue voters. I complied. For a long time this lamb was silent. Then, I watched my country decline. Why, I wondered?

Because a lamb was silenced.

I became highly political and an activist for my political beliefs. I began to attempt to persuade others to the platforms and policies I aligned with. I felt engaged. I felt I might actually make a difference.

And then... I became a Pastor. Now? I am prohibited from endorsing any candidate.

Again... A lamb had once again be silenced.

But not you.

If we allow 20 to 30 million Christian lambs to be silenced in this cycle, and society is plunged even more into a Post-Christian, Post-Scriptural Society that our Founders warned would come...

... only the silent lambs will be to blame.
